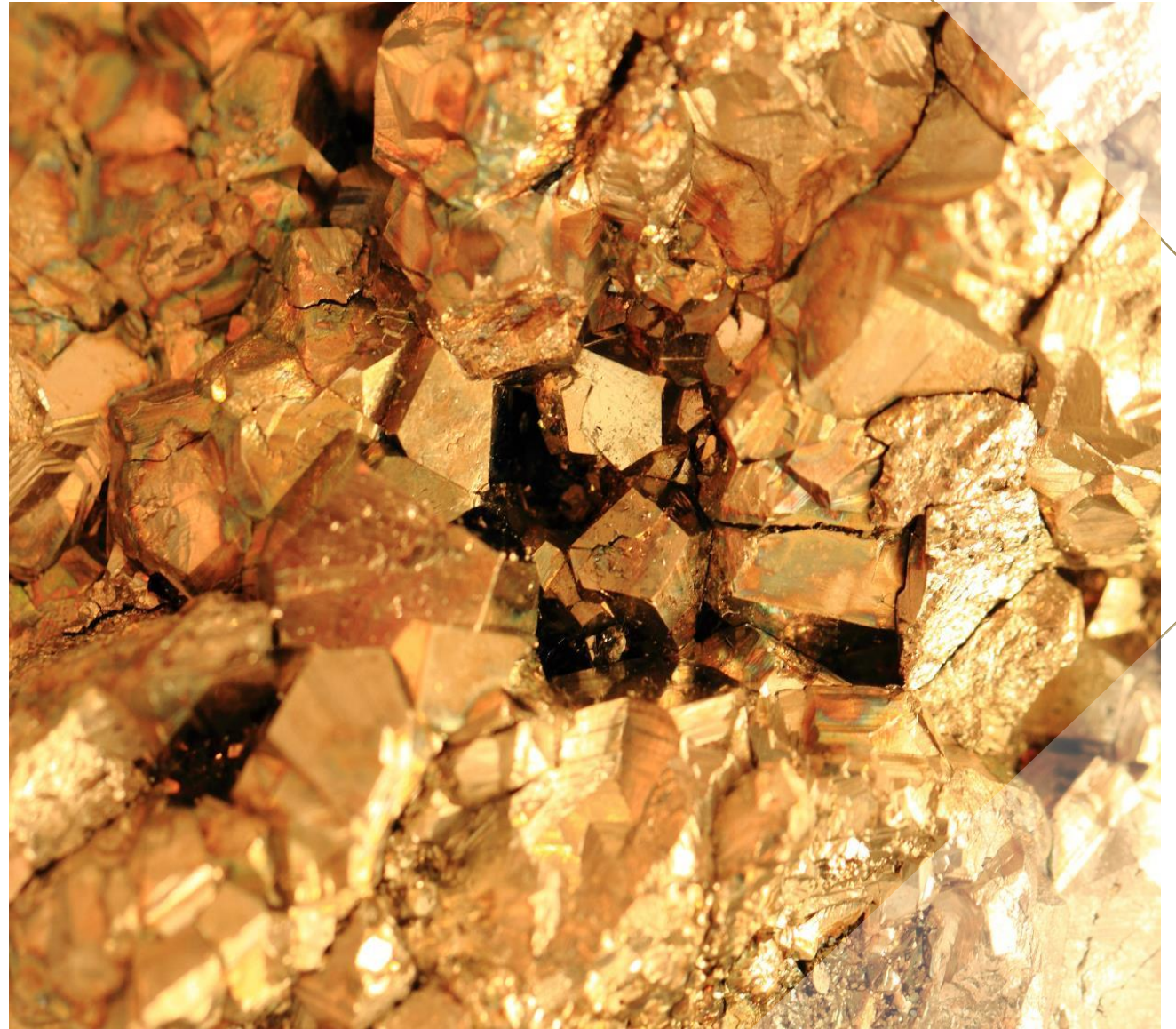


Acknowledgement of Country

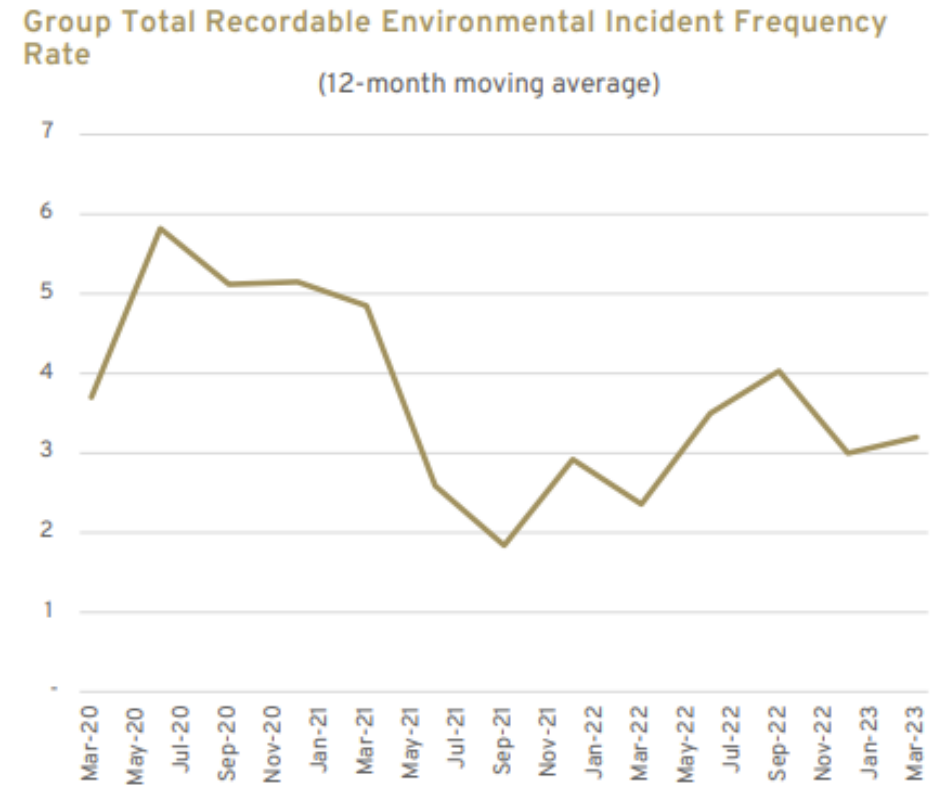
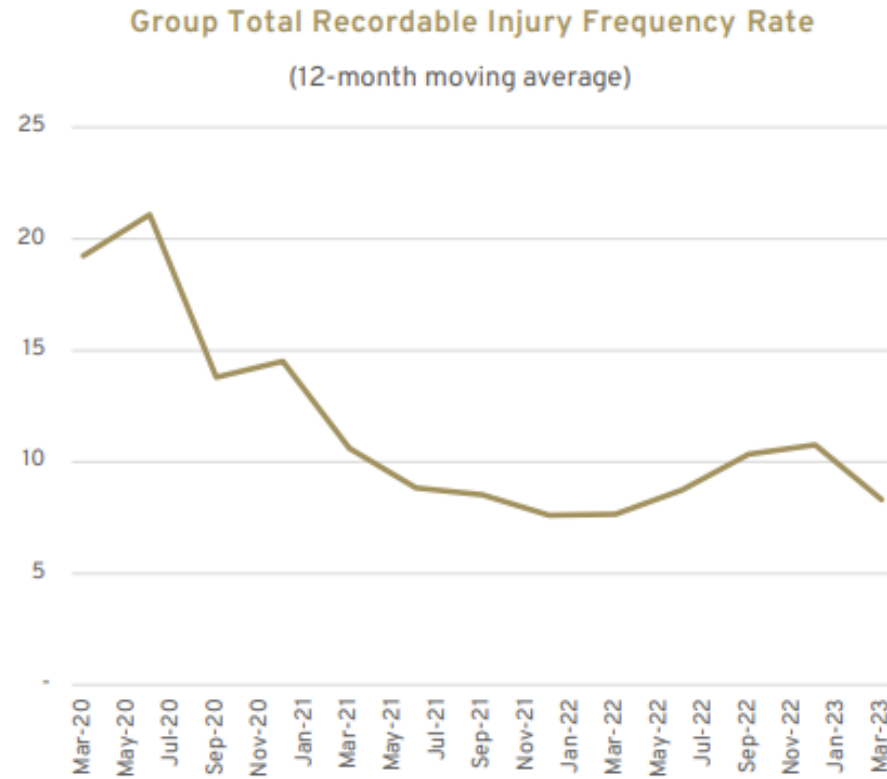

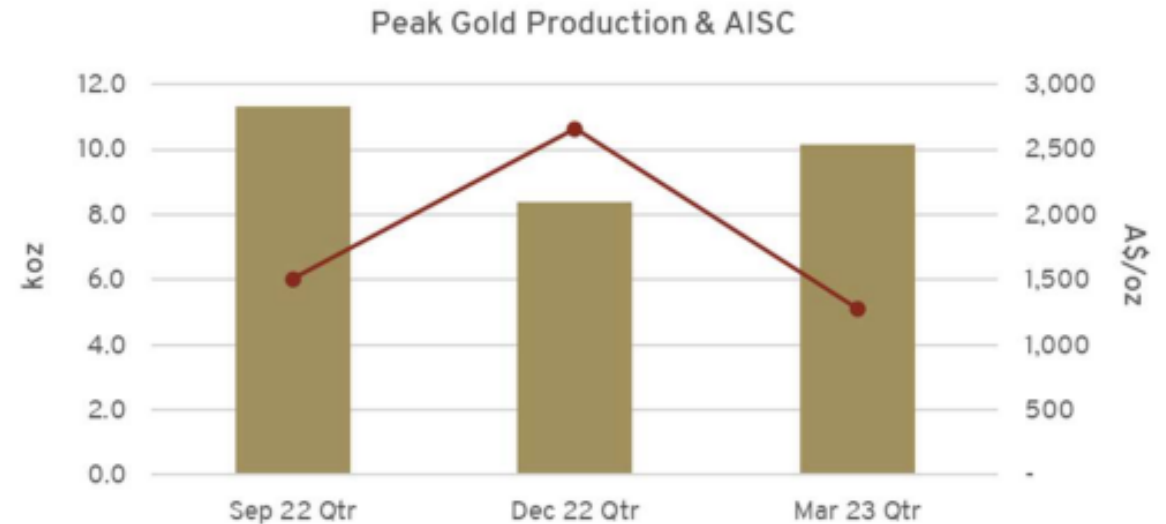
No recordable injuries in Q3 FY23 with strong safety focus during organisational renewal



PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT | PEAK

Marked improvement in production and cost

- Gold, zinc and lead metal production increased more than 20% above the December quarter, benefitting from higher grades in the ore feed
- Peak's AISC reduced to A\$1,279/oz (DecQ: A\$2,659/oz) due to higher gold sales, lower mine operating costs and reduced sustaining capital expenditure
- Construction of the Stage 5 Tailings Storage Facility embankment raise was completed on time and on budget, providing capacity for approximately five years of ore processing

- Routine Hygiene Monitoring conducted on underground workers

- At the end of March, the combined Peak Gold Mine Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate (TRIFR) remained steady with the 12-month rolling average at 9.22

1 Community a critical stakeholder

Environmental Incidents, Complaints & Initiatives – January – March 23

1 Environmental Incidents

- A dead snake was found on the Tailings Storage Facility. While it was reported to the EPA, due to the lacerations on the snake, death is not believed to have been caused by operations at the TSF.
- A fire occurred at the Peak concrete batching plant, on the 3rd March 2023 at approximately 3.00pm. The mine was evacuated, and emergency services attended, all run off from putting the fire out was contained. Due to the expected monetary damage caused by the fire being over \$10,000 it is being reported as a material harm event under Part 5.7 of the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997.

2 Complaints

- One complaint was received during the period regarding blast vibration. The complaint received correlated to a PGM blast. Monitoring data received from blast monitors confirmed compliance with licence conditions.

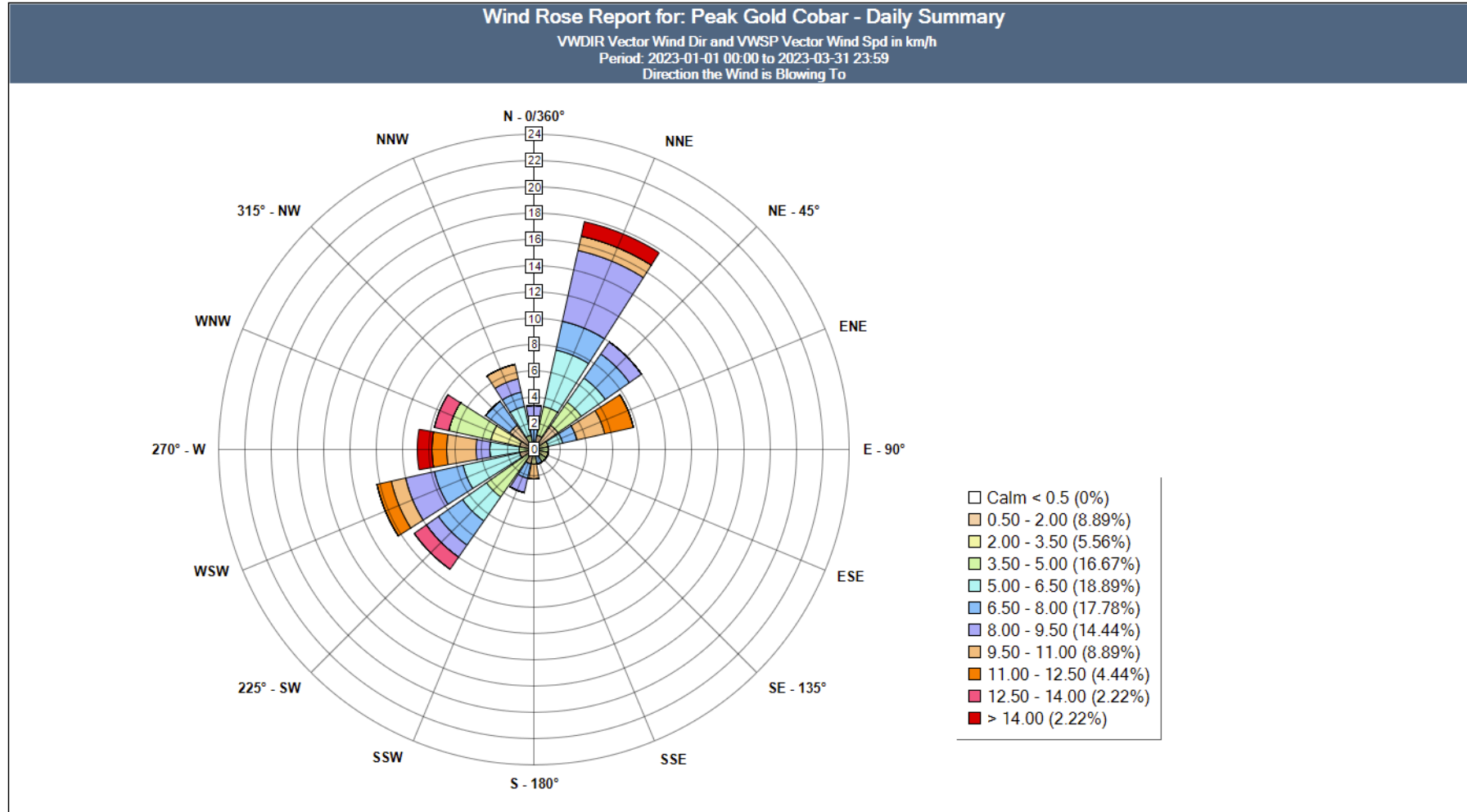
3 Environment and Community Initiatives

- The Geology team spoke at the Cobar Highschool for the “Teacher Earth Science Education Program” funded by Aurelia Metals



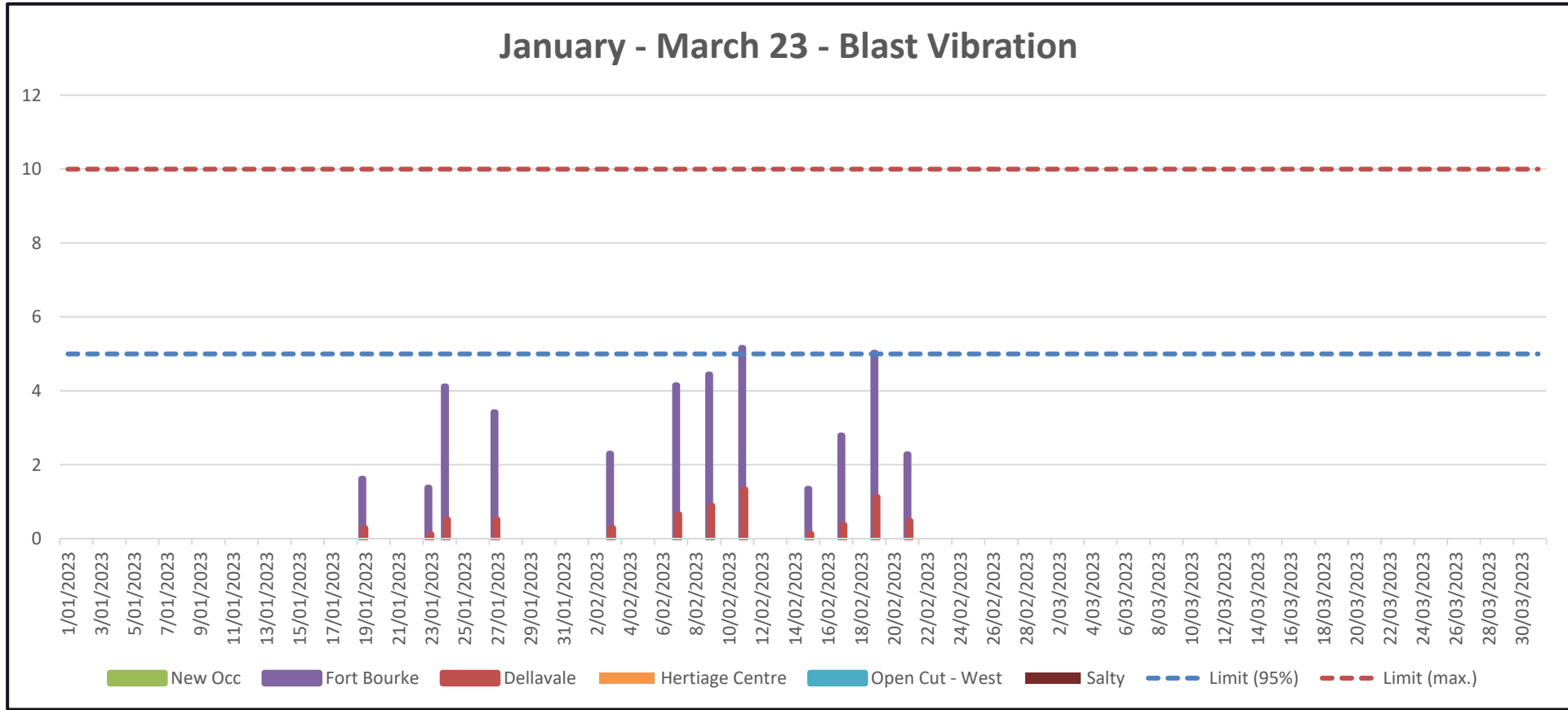

Environmental Monitoring – January - March 23



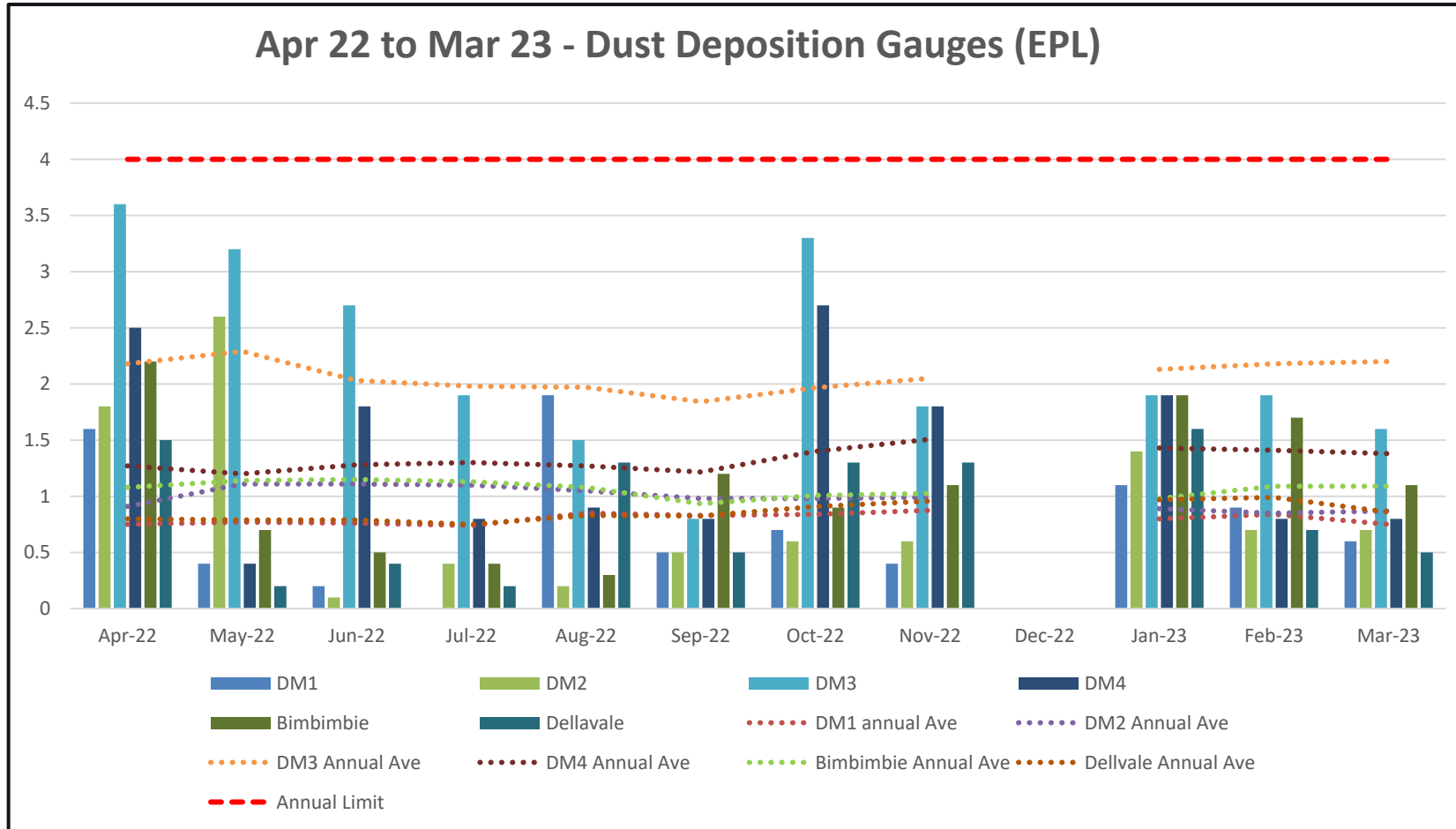

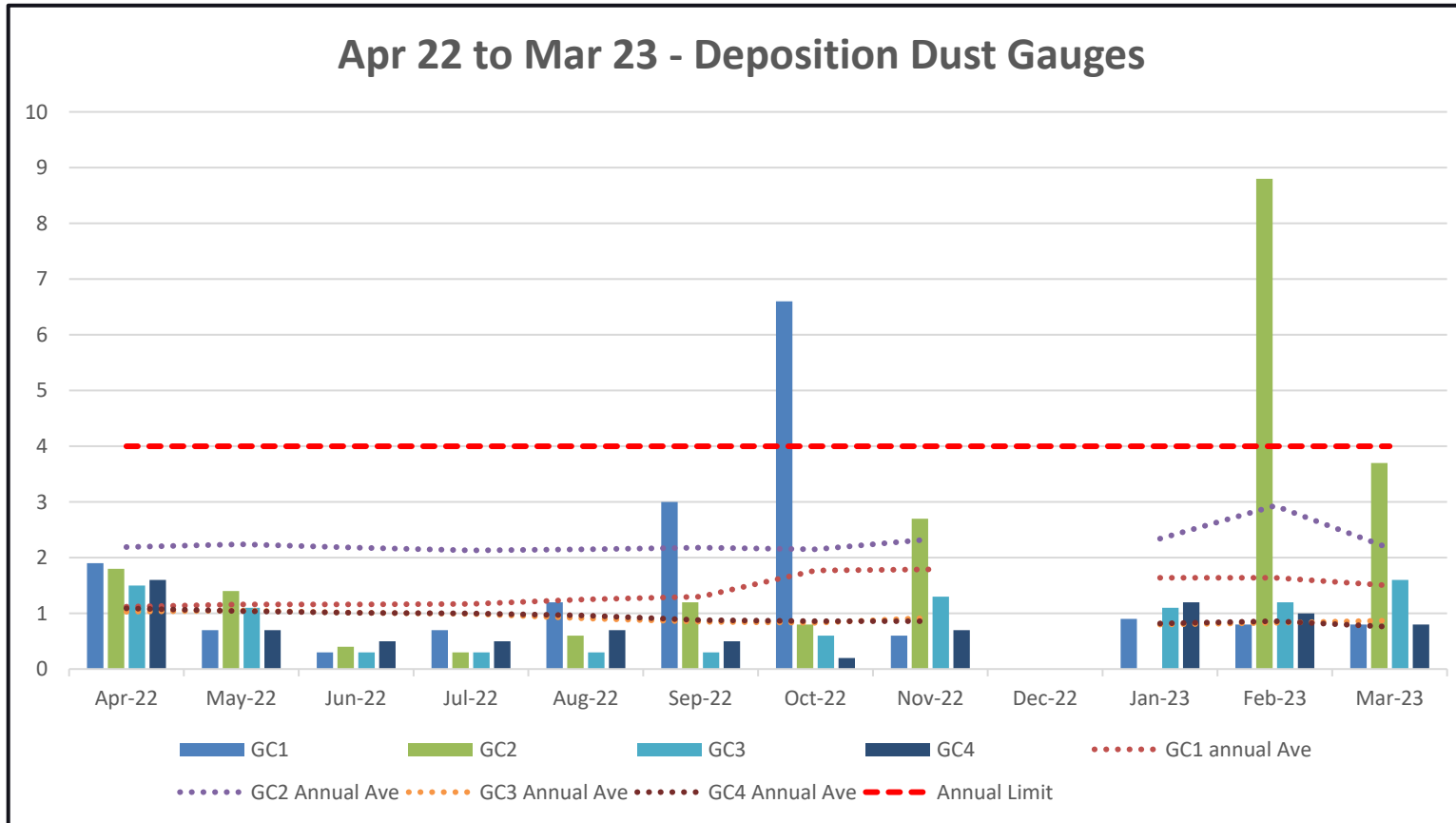
Environmental Monitoring - April 22 - March 23
