

Steady performance amidst significant organisational change


- TRIFR remains stable with a slight rise to 10.77 (SepQ: 10.35)
- Mental health audit to commence in March quarter to ensure appropriate actions during organisational change
- REIFR improved to 2.99 (SepQ: 4.03) due to fewer recordable events

Group Total Recordable Environmental Incident Frequency Rate (REIFR) 12 month moving average






March quarter to benefit from cost control activities

- Very strong production and cost performance in December
- Cost optimisation through transition to owner mining model
- Owner mining roles mostly filled with workforce numbers approaching planned levels at the end of December
- Hours worked in the mining department reduced by 47% from June to December 2022 providing the platform for higher productivity and lower labour costs
- Delivery of the first of two new underground haul trucks, yielding an immediate 50% payload improvement compared to the demobilised trucks

Peak Work, Health and Safety - October - December 22

1 Positive activity

- Lead indicator activity by departments for the period was at full practical compliance
- Random and scheduled Alcohol and Drug testing continued during the period with 439 tests undertaken. There were 12 non-negative results obtained.
- Mines Rescue recruited 6 x new members
- · Mines Rescue team completed Confined Space Rescue, Advanced First Aid and Occupational Skillset and attended Miners Ghost Festival
- TARP Training was conducted and completed
- · GCG monitoring onsite Lead investigations for truck drivers and workers on LMP
- Periodic Medicals conducted on Employees
- Wet Weather Risk Assessment Completed

2 Critical Control Verifications

- Total of 35 Critical Control Verifications were captured within October, November and December
- 22 Improvement Actions were created from these Verifications
- Fatal Hazards Audit conducted
- 6 monthly Systems review underway

Lag indicators

- October: 1 Recordable injury and 5 First Aid Injuries
- November: 6 First Aid Injuries
- December: 3 First Aid Injuries and 1 Restricted Duties
- At the end of December, the combined Peak Gold Mine Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate (TRIFR) remained steady with the 12-month rolling average at 10.89
- Blood lead level collection monthly update 8 Individual BLMP

1 Community a critical stakeholder

- A donation to Catholic Care of \$1500 for domestic violence awareness event "Reclaim the Night"

- Submitted Traffic Management Plan to DPIE (Since approved 25.1.23)







Jan 22 to Dec 22 - Dust Deposition Gauges (EPL)




Note: December results rendered invalid data due to collection delays. All results were under EPL limits. EPL requires quarterly sampling, so no non-compliance to conditions.
