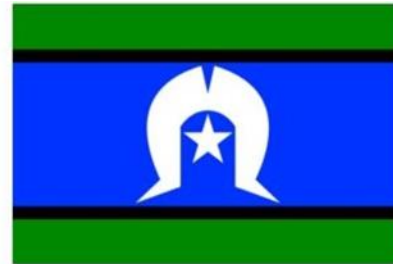

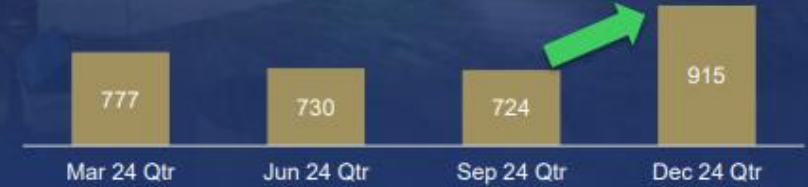

Development metres



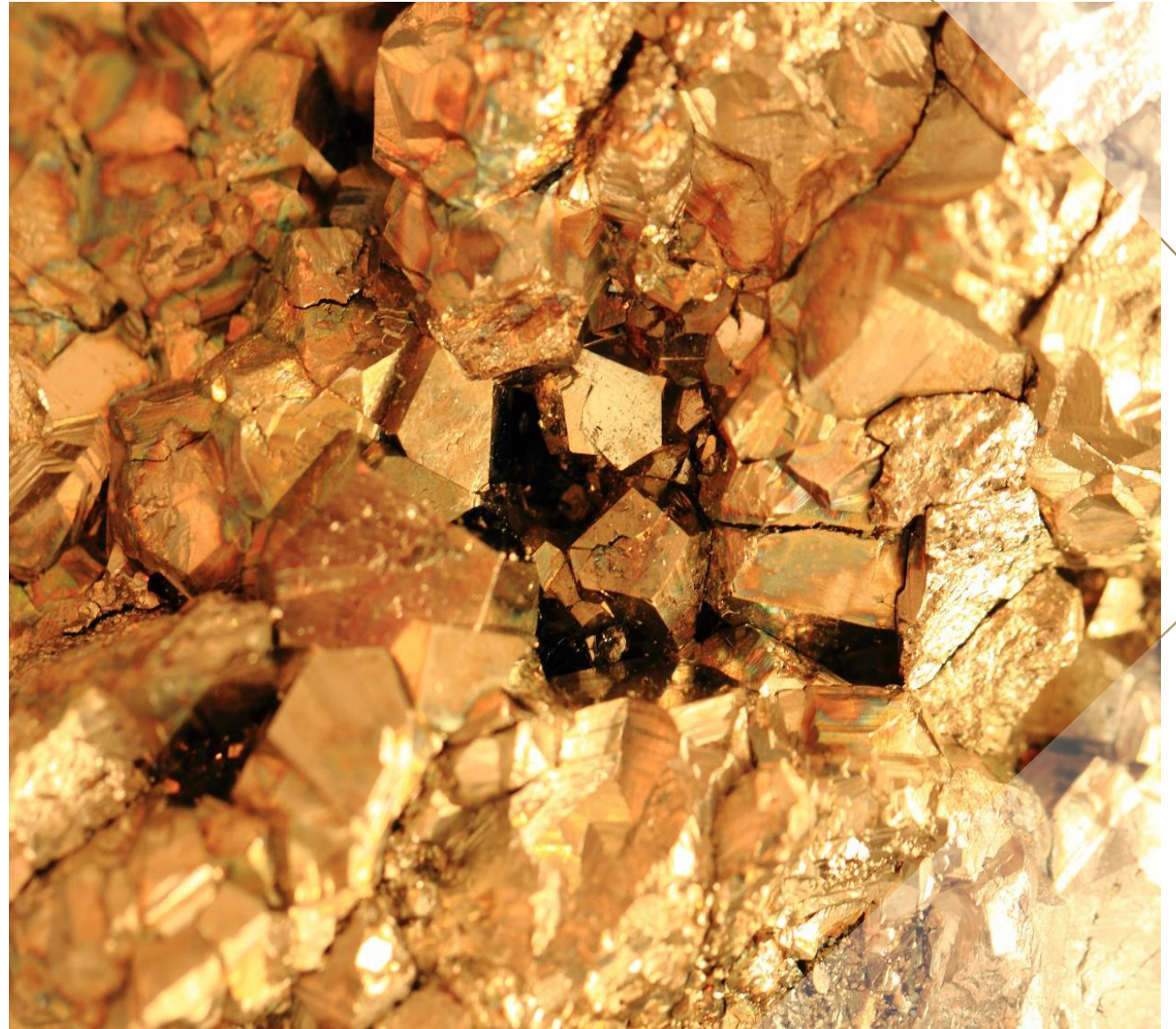
Mining unit cost / tonne

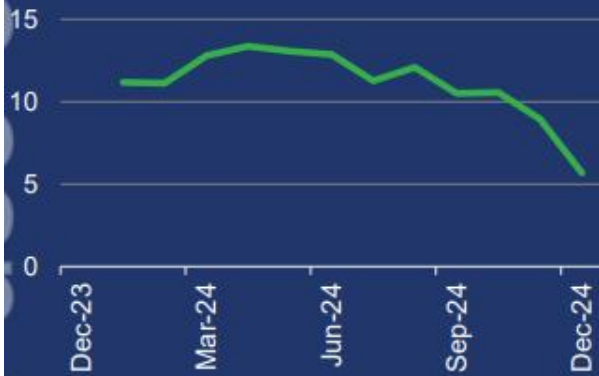
Health and Safety

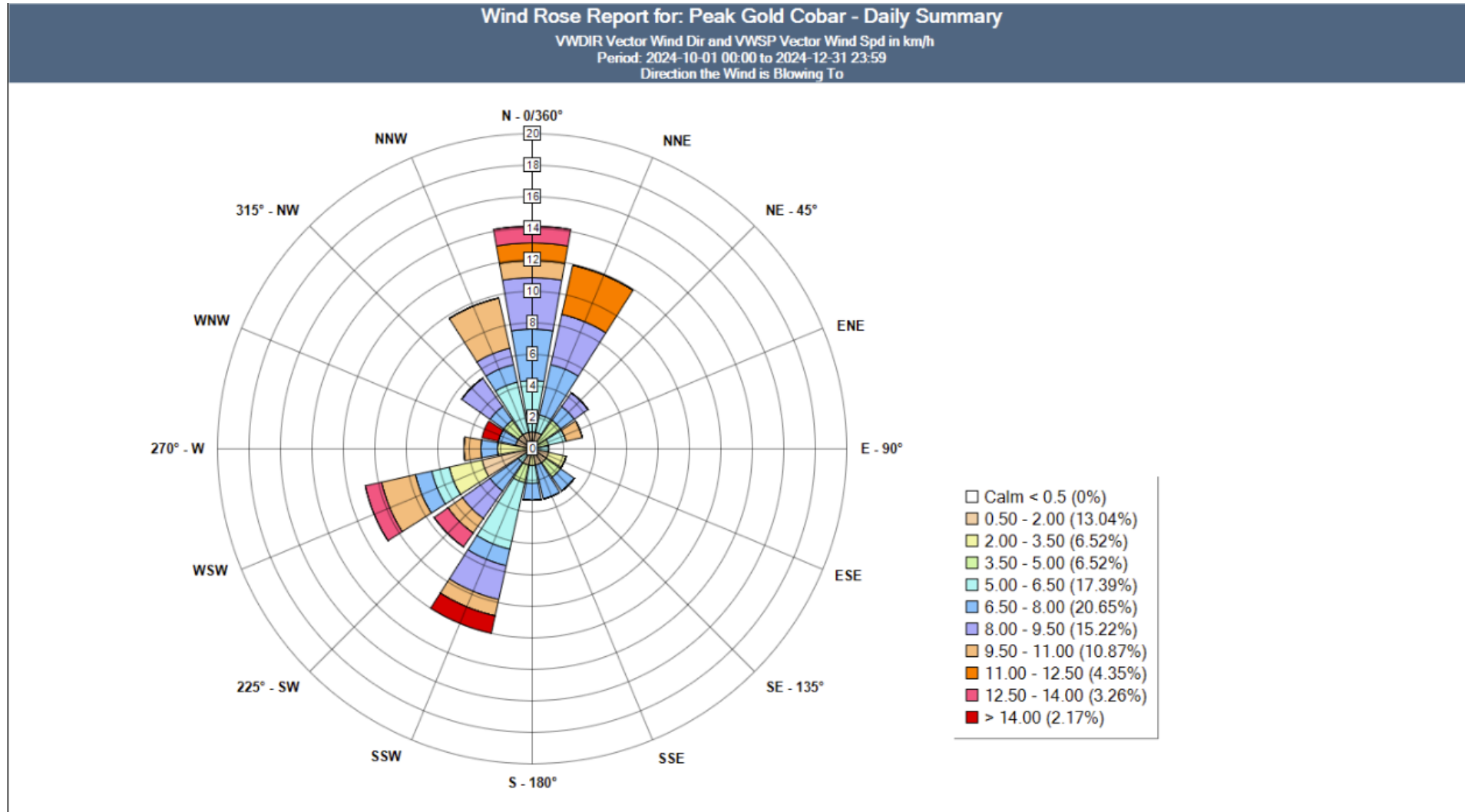

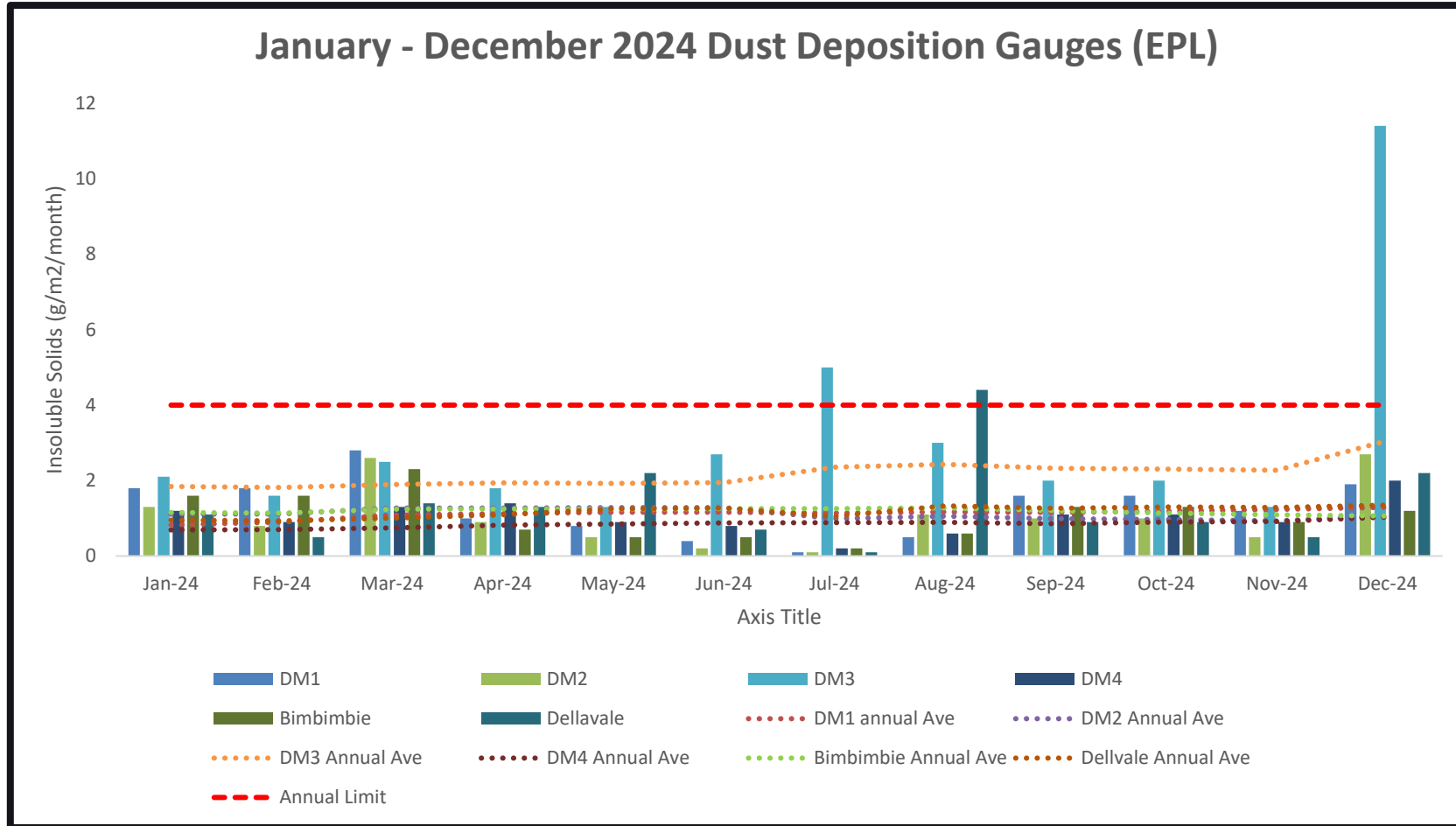
1 complaint was received on 5th November regarding blasting. Confirmed to be within compliance.

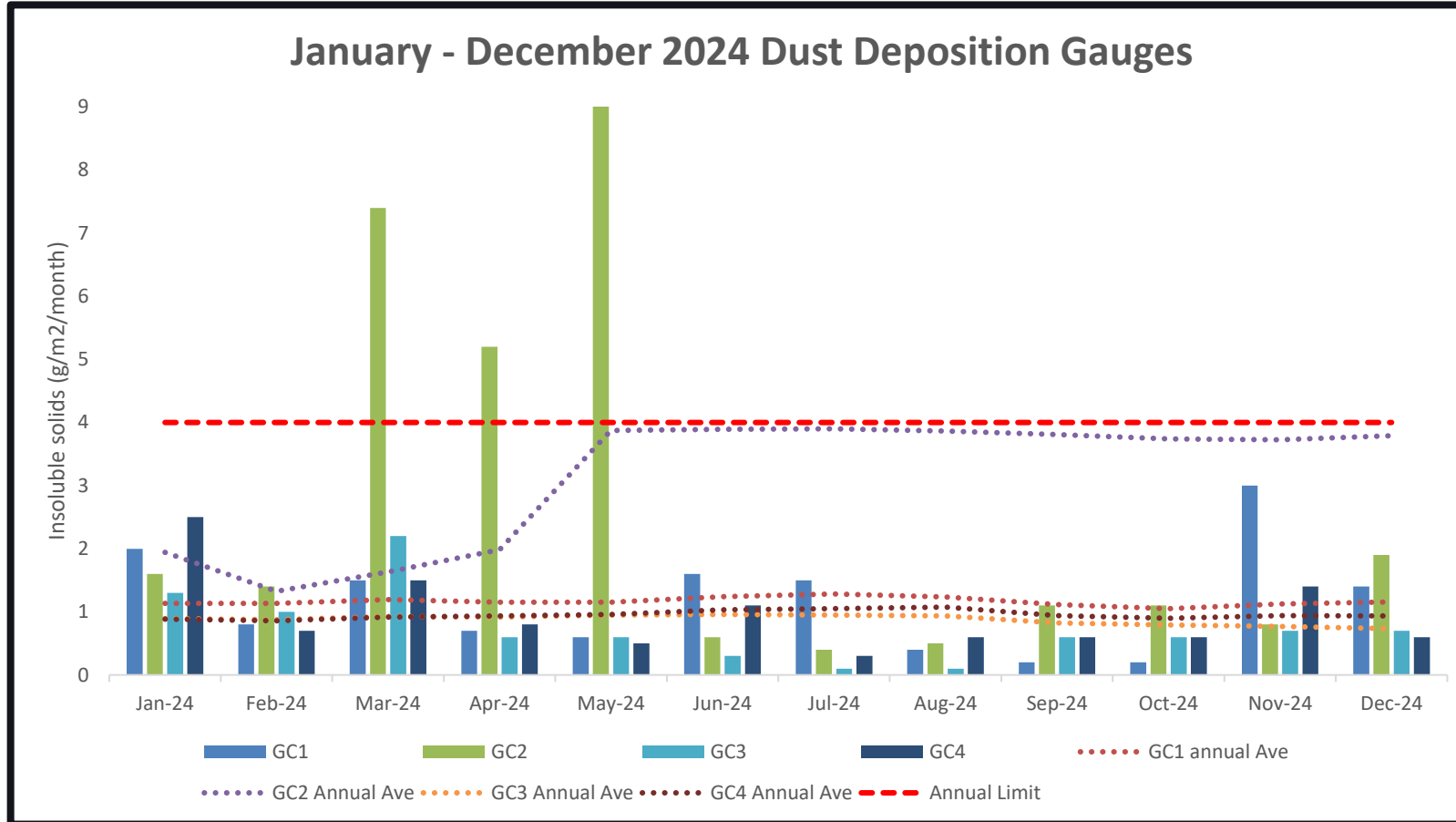

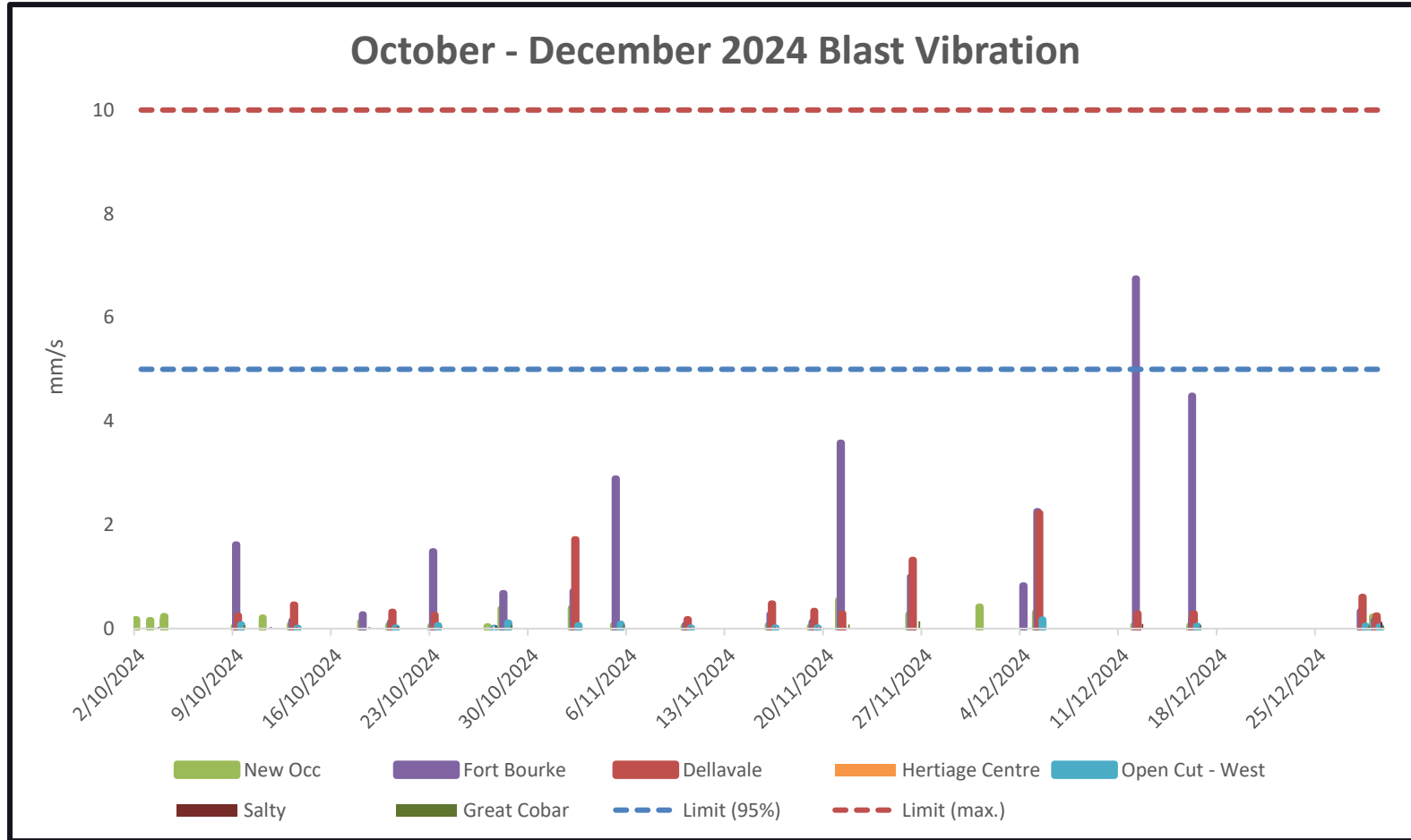
