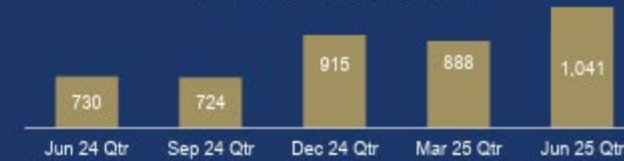

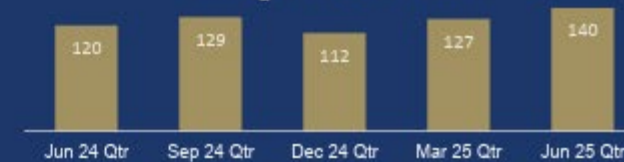
Productivity improvements remain a key focus

- Plant recoveries continue to improve for Zinc

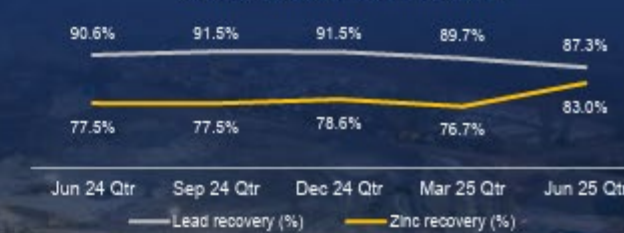
Development metres



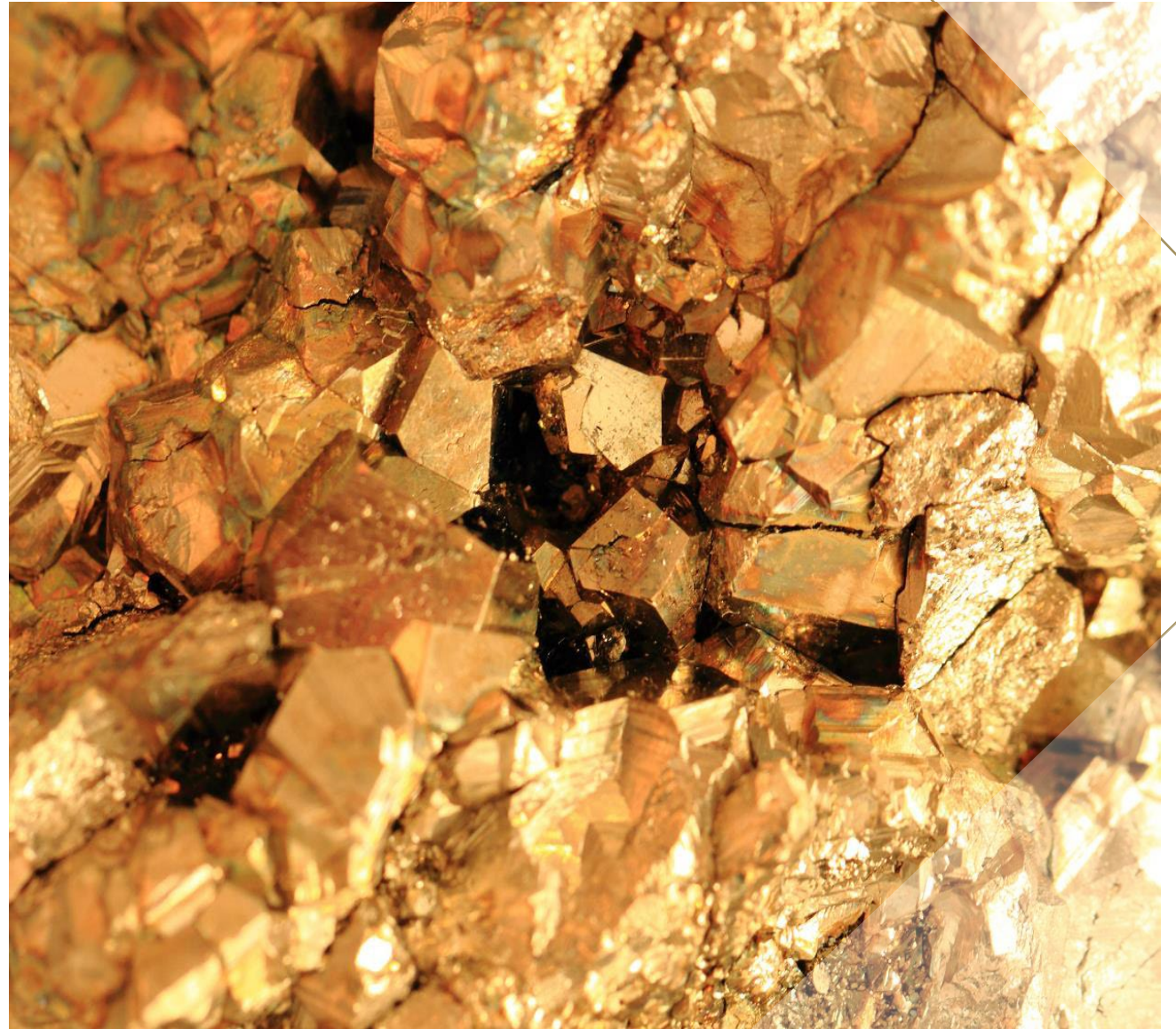
Mining unit cost / tonne

Health and Safety

- 2 x Hand injuries at Peak requiring medical treatment
- Safety injury rates trended up in the quarter but have plateaued at 5.5 for the Financial Year
- Peak ended the financial year lost time injury free and recording only 5 recordable injuries for the year
- Increased focus on dust monitoring and getting ready for a respiratory protection policy to be introduced in Q1 FY26

Community a critical stakeholder (Q3 and Q4 FY 25)

- BATYR received \$21,667 to run 12 batyr@school programs and 3 school chapter programs over a three-year period at the Cobar Highschool.

- The Cobar Weekly received \$1,000 to help run the Christmas Light Competition.

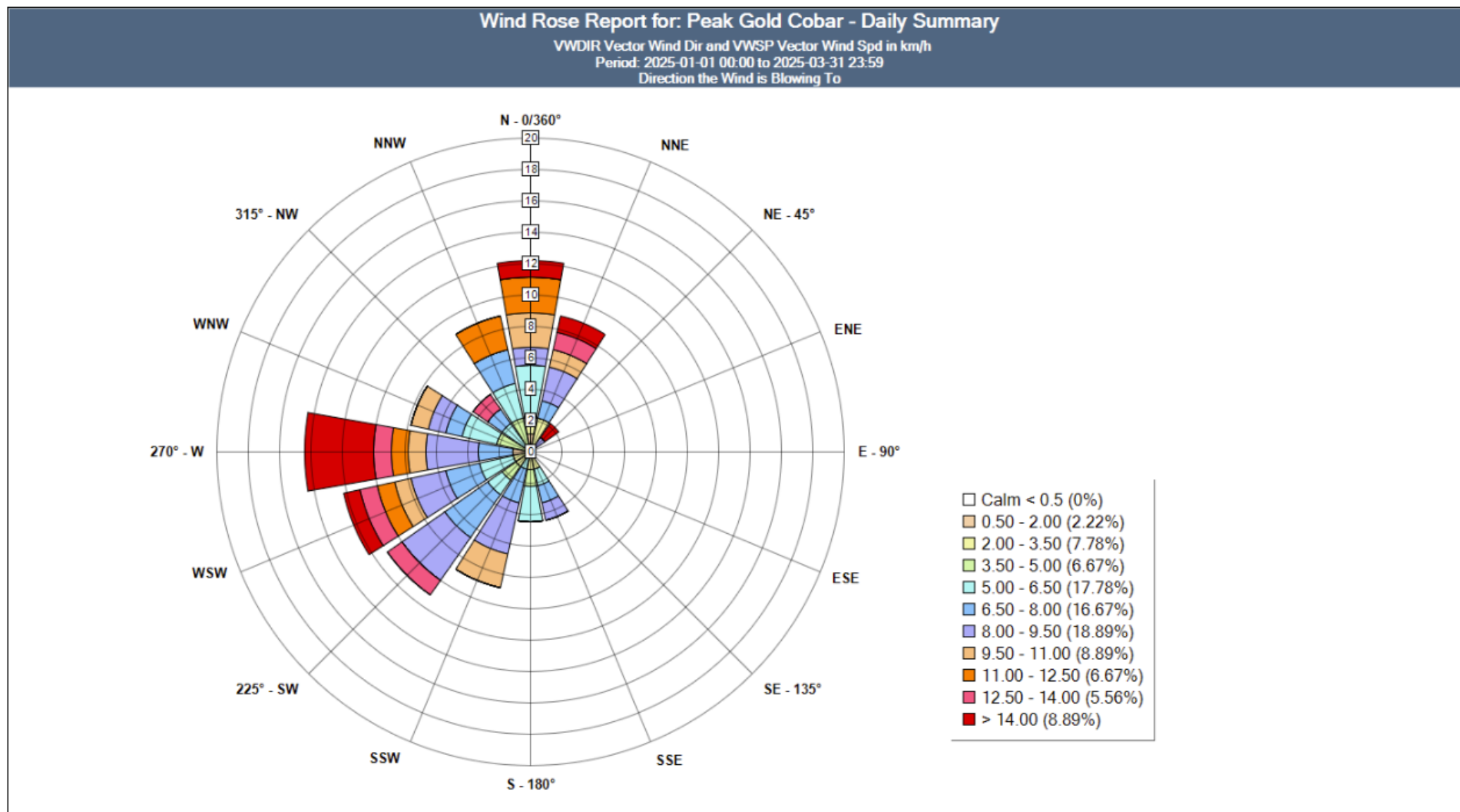

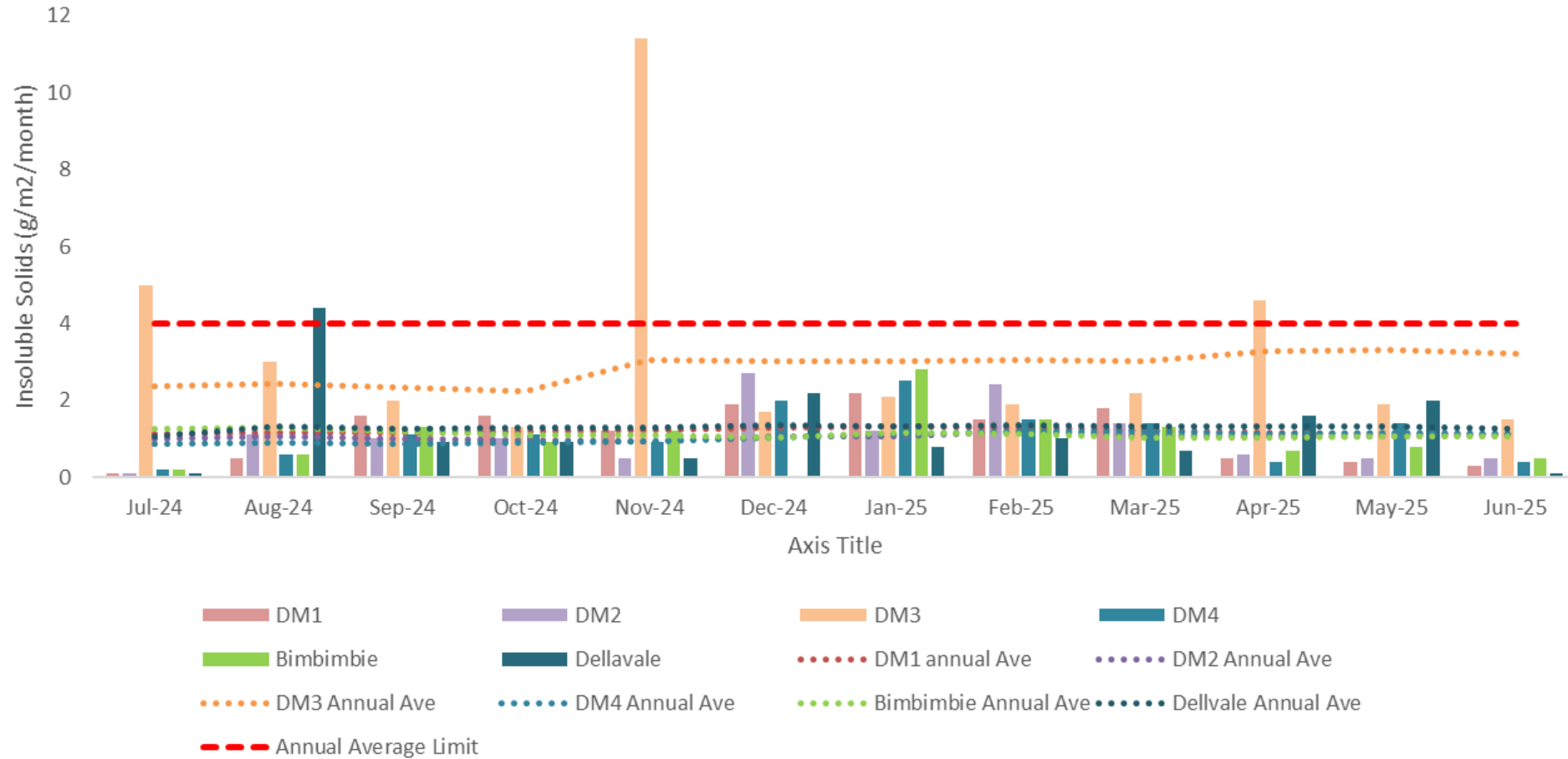

One complaint was received during the period regarding maintenance of the winder house.

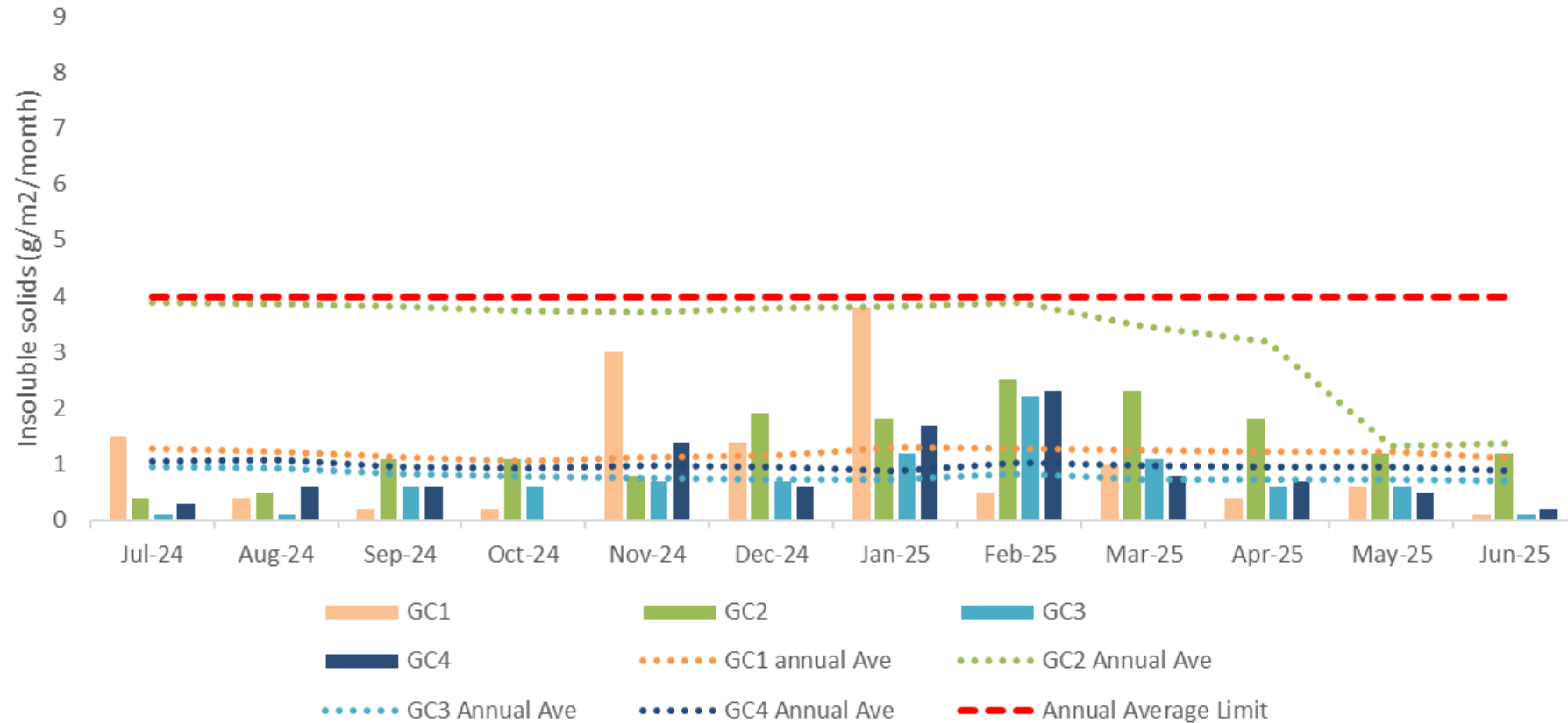


FY 2025 Dust Deposition Gauges (EPL)



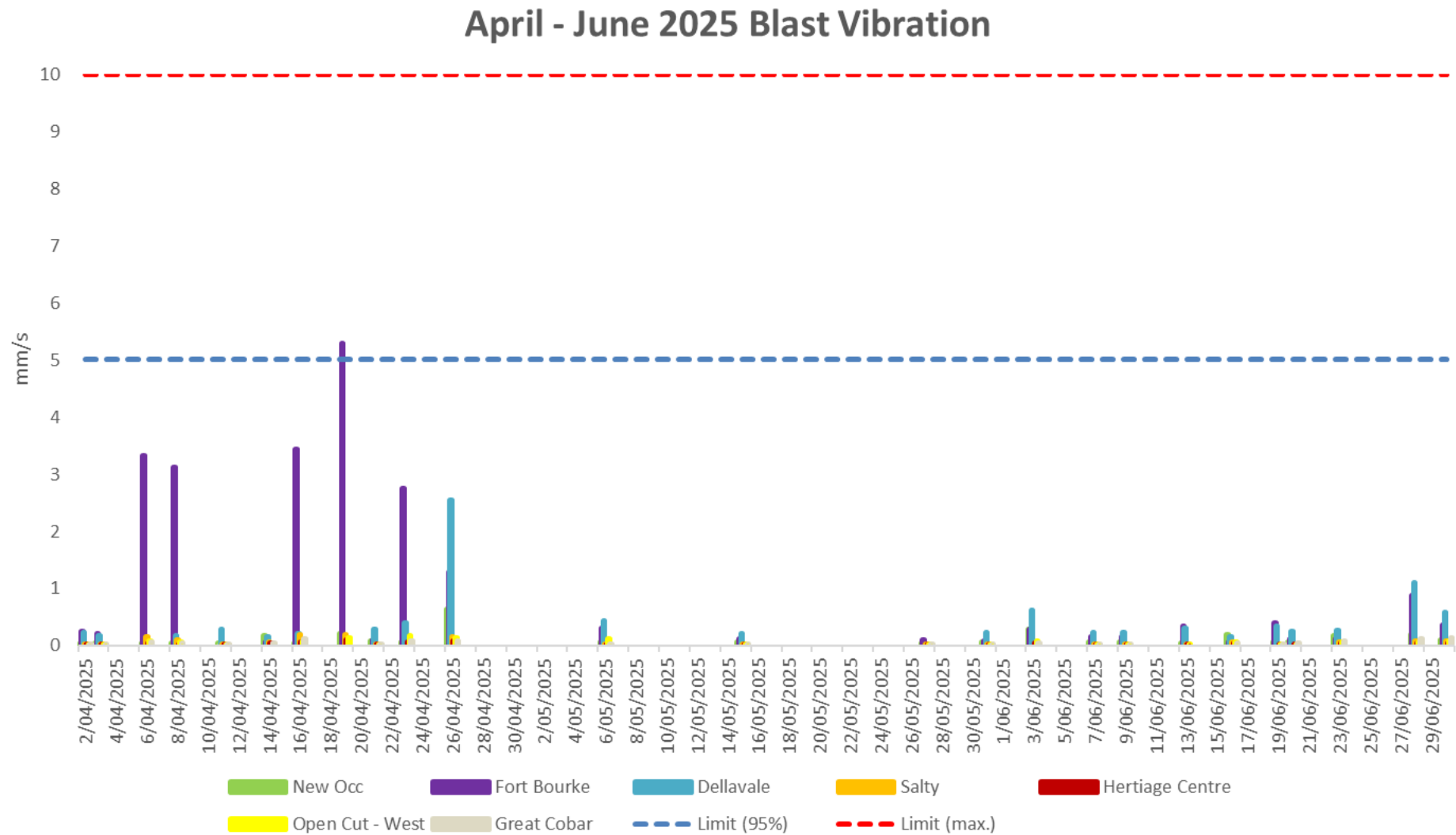
Note: Increased levels of insoluble solids in DM3 and Dellavale in July and August respectively were due to plant material. DM3 Nov 24 (that is depositional dust collected from 4.11-4.12.2025) levels were much higher than usual, most likely due to high wind conditions during the month and insect matter present in the sample.

Note:

Levels of insoluble solids in April and May 2024 for GC2 were due to frogs in the containers (increasing annual average). All results for FY2025 are under EPL limits.



Percentage of Blasts exceeding 5mm/s during FY2025 is 0.81%, which is below the 5% EPL limit.

Regional programs continue to support organic growth

Nymagee

- Intersected high-grade Cu and Zn-Pb mineralisation¹
 - 5.2m (3.8m ETW) @ 3.0% Cu, 5g/t Ag in NMD106 from 132.0m
 - 4.1m (3.2m ETW) @ 9.9% Zn, 5.7% Pb, 0.3% Cu, 78g/t Ag in NMD106 from 292.4m
- Downhole Electromagnetic (DHEM) survey provides targets for future drilling
